Combined Charts of ERR French Library Seizure Victims¹

As a further aid to research regarding N-S library plunder in France, the following Excel Charts combine the names of ERR library-seizure victims appearing on all ten lists. The **first** chart lists individuals or families; the **second** lists institutions or organizations.

Column B presents victims' names on the first line in boldface type in corrected French forms for individuals or institutions, as would have been registered in France. To the extent possible names have been verified in contemporary prewar Paris directories, in French authority files or, on occasion, in postwar claims; first names are added only if confirmed. Alternate forms of the name, such as the Germanized original or variants used by the ERR, and names in the country of birth for individual émigrés, are given in brackets. Pseudonyms are indicated where identification has been possible, and confirmed if supplied by the ERR. When orthography varies in different ERR lists, relevant list numbers are indicated in parentheses.

Column C renders addresses of seizure, in official French form, with Paris arrondissements indicated. Addresses given were usually the home address but may also have been a storage company or other location.

Column D gives only the ERR identification or characterization of the victim (in English translation) with the list number where the German text was found. No further additions are added from outside sources. The frequent Nazi expression 'geflüchteter Jude' is rendered in English consistently as 'fugitive Jew' rather than 'émigré'; in some cases, the individuals had fled to the unoccupied South of France or were in hiding.

Column E gives all the ERR list numbers where the same name appears. Date(s) of seizure (**Column F**), are followed by the number of crates and the codes the ERR used for marking the crates (**Column G**), with the number of the list from which the data were derived.

Column H renders in English any commentary the ERR provided about the nature or subject matter of the books seized, and in many cases also archives or personal papers (again with the list number). Indicated destinations are occasionally noted in **Column I**.
